

Manager of Transportation Engineering & Data

WAMPO is seeking to fill the position of ***Manager of Transportation Engineering & Data***.

The ***Manager of Transportation Engineering & Data*** is responsible for managing Transportation Engineering & Data tasks pertaining to the planning process in the WAMPO region. This position is responsible for tasks related to transportation engineering, transportation modeling, transportation planning applications, transportation system performance metrics, data collection, data maintenance, data trends analysis, data presentation, and forecasting. This position is responsible for assisting in the administration of transportation-related programs and planning studies, transportation research and innovation, federal government transportation programs, data management, and grant administration. This position will assist in the MTP development, securing federal funding for transportation infrastructure investments (road, bridge, transit, and multimodal projects) in the WAMPO area through the development of transportation capital investment plans (TIP), long-range transportation plans, specific corridor studies, safety studies, and various other plans. This action is performed to ensure the region remains eligible to receive federal transportation funding and meets federal funding mandates.

Duties: Typical tasks and duties of the Manager of Transportation Engineering & Data may include, but are not limited to the following:

- Manage tasks related to transportation engineering, transportation demand modeling, transportation planning applications, transportation system performance metrics, data collection, data maintenance, data trends analysis, data presentation, and forecasting.
- Implement the Metropolitan Planning Organization's transportation planning process for the WAMPO area in compliance with federal and state regulations.
- Assist Director of MPO in performing urban transportation planning activities and coordinating the regional planning program with federal and state activities, plans, and programs; ensure that the transportation planning process is performed in compliance with the currently effective UPWP.
- Prepare reports, develop and/or coordinate elements of the WAMPO Long Range Transportation Plan including research and analysis of roads, bridges, public transportation, air, rail, freight, and non-motorized transportation.
- Develop population projections, maps, and financial forecasts for the Regional Plan and specific plans and analyze the environmental and societal impacts of transportation

projects. Coordinate with team members in the development of MTP's financial plan and forecasts.

- Coordinate transportation aspects of land development with the municipalities, developers, KDOT, FTA, and FHWA.
- Meet with local governments concerning transportation infrastructure from roadway systems and rail networks to pedestrian and bike facilities.
- Organize workshops and presentations for the purpose of informing local agencies on transportation issues affecting the region.
- Oversee the work of consultants retained to work on transportation projects. Prepare written reports, contractual agreements, project scopes, as well assist in preparation of RFP's.
- Manage Transportation Team staff in the use of the region's travel demand forecasting model, GIS and TransCAD, among other tools.
- Administer grants; review grant requests and assist local agencies in leveraging project grant funding.
- Conduct and participate in a Federal Certification Review, essentially an audit of the transportation planning process, conducted by a joint Federal Highway Administration/Federal Transit Administration review team. This audit ensures that the transportation planning process is being performed in a manner that meets federal requirements and ensures the region remains eligible to receive federal transportation infrastructure funds. This audit occurs every four years.
- Supervise direct reports, train direct reports, and assign tasks to direct reports.
- Other tasks as assigned by the supervisor.

Knowledge, Skills and Abilities Required:

1. Comprehensive knowledge of methods, practices, and procedures involved in transportation planning, engineering, metropolitan planning organization operations, and management.
2. Knowledge of transportation engineering, traffic engineering and safety laws.
3. Ability to oversee contract administration and implement good record keeping practices.
4. Ability to write clear and concise reports as well as prepare grant proposals and administer grants.
5. Ability to multitask and set priorities.
6. Ability to utilize analytical, organizational, and problem-solving skills to support sound decision-making.
7. Ability to build consensus and maintain a culture of collaboration.

8. Skills in providing customer service.
9. Ability to actively participate in and give back to the community through established professional organizations and networks.
10. Ability to manage projects effectively and meet firm deadlines
11. Ability to maintain effective working relationships with elected and appointed officials and the general public.
12. Ability to exercise sound judgment in project management roles.
13. Ability to maintain integrity, credibility, and dedication to the mission of WAMPO.

Education and Experience Required: Minimum qualifications for the Manager of Transportation Engineering & Data shall consist of a bachelor's degree in Engineering, or experience with software programming and engineering, modeling & forecasting. A minimum of 8 years of private consulting firm experience is preferred with PE (Professional Engineering) license certification. Government agency experience is a plus.

The selected candidate must pass a background check, post-offer physical and alcohol/drug test, and have a valid driver's license.

About Wichita:

Wichita is an urban area with an excellent standard of living, good schools, an excellent local University (Wichita State University), an appealing cost of living, with reasonable housing costs, a vibrant downtown with great theatre and local events, with Riverwalk recreational amenities & festival events. The commute here is great with many of our staff living within a 1- to 10-mile radius of the office.

About WAMPO:

WAMPO is the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for the Wichita metropolitan region. WAMPO area population is about 550,000.

MPOs are federally required regional policy bodies in urbanized areas with populations over 50,000. MPOs recognize the critical links between transportation and other societal goals such as economic health, air quality, social equity, environmental resource consumption, and overall quality of life. WAMPO is responsible, in cooperation with the State of Kansas and Wichita Transit, for carrying out the metropolitan transportation planning process in 22 cities and 3 counties in South Central Kansas.

Benefits include: health/dental/vision/life insurance and an optional flexible spending account (FSA). After six months of employment, an optional retirement plan is available (WAMPO matches up to a specific percentage). Paid time off includes: 10 vacation days accrued per year, 6 sick days accrued per year, and 12 paid holidays (including 1 personal day).
