# **Transportation Safety**

#### Safe Routes to School

WAMPO is in the midst of a regional effort to develop Safe Routes to School (SRTS) plans for public and private K-12 schools throughout the region, and data collection efforts are underway. SRTS aims to make walking and bicycling to and from school safer for students through infrastructure improvements, programs, and policies. WAMPO staff and consultants are teaming up with school and local government staff to complete a walk audit at and around each of the participating schools, schools have collected Student Travel Tally data on how students get to and from school; and more than 2,100 survey responses have been submitted by parents/caregivers sharing their thoughts and experiences regarding their student(s) walking, biking, and rolling to school. Additionally, WAMPO staff have attended community events to increase awareness and engage residents.







Once school-specific SRTS plans are in place, projects and activities identified in those plans will be better positioned to take advantage of future funding opportunities.

# ICT Safe: A Regional Transportation Coalition

ICT Safe's mission is to reduce transportation-related fatalities and serious injuries in the WAMPO region. It has several smaller groups under its umbrella, including the Active Transportation Committee and Drive Safe Sedgwick. Topics discussed at the Fall 2025 ICT Safe meeting held on November 5, 2025, included the WAMPO Comprehensive Safety Action Plan (CSAP), protected-intersection designs, Bike Walk Wichita's Behavioral Safety Campaign, and KDOT safety-related updates.

#### **KDOT Walk Bike Roll Active Transportation Summit**

The Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) hosted the Walk Bike Roll Kansas Active Transportation Summit on October 29-30, 2025, in Lawrence, KS. The two-day summit focused on the latest safety research and infrastructure designs to better support people who walk, bike, or use mobility devices. Kim Negrete, WAMPO's Multimodal Transportation Safety Planner, provided the closing keynote presentation.

# 2025 Bicycle and Pedestrian Count Report

The 2025 Bicycle and Pedestrian Count took place on September 10, 11, and 13, 2025 - Thank you so much to all our volunteers! Volunteer participation is crucial for comprehensive data collection used to enhance understanding of how people are using nonmotorized modes of transportation and inform future transportation planning. In addition to volunteer counters, automatic counting equipment was deployed at nine (9) of the forty (40) locations to aid with data collection.

Data collected each year are used to estimate the Annual Average Daily Traffic (AADT) of bicycle riders and pedestrians, based on national standards. WAMPO staff have compiled data and performed analyses to develop a comprehensive report and corresponding interactive map.

The top five locations in terms of estimated AADT are: Arkansas River Path at Keeper of the Plains; Broadway and Central; Sedgwick County Park at 21st Street; Prairie Sunset Trail; and Sedgwick County Park at 13th Street.

# **Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP)**

The Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) describes what planning activities WAMPO staff and consultants will undertake, and how federal planning funds allocated to WAMPO will be used during the year (January 1-December 31). The UPWP is a crucial document for guiding and managing the transportation planning process within a metropolitan area, ensuring that resources are used effectively and that planning efforts are coordinated and transparent. Funding for the UPWP comes from various sources, including federal Consolidated Planning Grant (CPG) funds, which require a 20% local match (i.e., 80% federal funding, 20% local funding).

#### **2026 UPWP**

The draft 2026 UPWP continues projects and activities outlined in the 2025 UPWP. WAMPO opened the public comment period for the 2026 UPWP from September 12, 2025, through October 12, 2025.

#### 2025 UPWP Amendment 2

Updates and amendments to the Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) are periodically necessary to adjust programmed amounts to better align with current and anticipated work. Proposed draft amendment 2 to the 2025 UPWP would adjust allocations between staff tasks, decrease overall operating and consultant-supported project expenditures to reflect completed work and revised work schedules, and account for the removal of a sub-task to purchase data. WAMPO opened the public comment period for Amendment 2 to the 2025 UPWP from October 10, 2025, through October 24, 2025.

# Regional Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) Architecture

Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) cover a wide range of technologies, including dynamic message signs that provide timely crash alerts, ramp closure updates, and important public service announcements. The number of intelligent devices in the WAMPO region is in the hundreds, and the way they are integrated adds another layer of complexity. To coordinate their use and deployment, regions develop an ITS Architecture, and maintenance of these architectures is often handled by MPOs, such as WAMPO. WAMPO launched a comprehensive update to its architecture in Fall 2024, and the project is now nearing completion.

The regional ITS architecture is being updated through a cooperative effort by regional transportation agencies and local governments. It represents a shared vision of how the region's ITS infrastructure components and maintainers will work together in the future, share information, and provide for a safer, more efficient, and more effective regional transportation system.

WAMPO opened the public comment period for the draft updated regional Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) architecture from October 18, 2025, through November 16, 2025. Public comments received during this period will be reported to and considered by the WAMPO Transportation Policy Body (TPB), which will decide whether to approve the draft regional ITS architecture at their November 18, 2025, meeting.

# Metropolitan Transportation Plan 2050 (MTP 2050)

The Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) is a federally required, strategic, long-term document guiding future transportation projects in the WAMPO region. The Metropolitan Transportation Plan 2050 (MTP 2050) development and approval process was completed when the Transportation Policy Body (TPB) approved it on May 13, 2025. MTP 2050 Amendment 1 was approved on August 12, 2025.

#### **Roadshow for Approved MTP 2050**

Following the conclusion of the MTP 2050 Amendment 1 development and approval process, WAMPO staff are carrying out a roadshow to present the document to the public. A "roadshow" is an outreach activity involving visits to multiple locations and events to promote something specific. This may include presentations at public meetings, attending community pop-up events, and social media posts to encourage ongoing use of the plan. # **Transportation Improvement Program**

All federally funded transportation projects within the WAMPO region, and any additional projects deemed regionally significant by WAMPO in partnership with key stakeholders, are required to appear in the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). These projects are made into a prioritized, four-year list representing funding commitments from local, state, and federal partners that benefit the region. The WAMPO Transportation Policy Body (TPB) approved the FFY2025-FFY2028 TIP on August 13, 2024. Changes to and additions/removals of specific projects are often required before the development of the next new TIP, so WAMPO conducts regularly scheduled amendments to the TIP, usually about four per year.

#### On the Horizon

#### **Regional Active Transportation Plan**

Active transportation is any human-powered (non-motorized) mode of transportation, such as walking or riding a bicycle. People who travel this way rely on infrastructure such as sidewalks, crosswalks, trails, shared-use paths, and bike lanes. Consistent with the WAMPO Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP), WAMPO will develop a Regional Active Transportation Plan to assess existing conditions, identify gaps in the nonmotorized-travel network, and recommend strategies and projects for improving regional connectivity for active transportation. The plan will guide future infrastructure investments across the region and support efforts to create a more connected, safe, and accessible active transportation network that links communities and key destinations. A consultant to assist WAMPO with plan development has been selected, and a contract is anticipated to be brought to the TPB by the end of 2025.


#### **Household Travel Survey (HTS)**

WAMPO issued a Request for Proposals (RFP) from July 28 through September 26, 2025, for a consultant to conduct a regional Household Travel Survey (HTS), and a selection committee is now in the process of interviewing consultant teams that submitted proposals. Relatively recent (usually within the last ten years) Household Travel Surveys are an essential tool for regional transportation planning, collecting details on the daily trips of all of the members of a sample of the households in the metropolitan area (e.g., trip origins, destinations, times, modes, and purposes) and on the characteristics of those households (e.g., number of people in the household, number of vehicles, household income). The primary use of these data is anticipated to be updating the regional Travel Demand Model (TDM), which uses population and employment projections to forecast future traffic volumes, congestion, and travel times throughout the WAMPO-region transportation network.
