# **Safety Updates**

#### Safe Routes to School

WAMPO is partnering with schools, school districts, and local governments to develop Safe Routes to School (SRTS) plans across the region. The SRTS program aims to make walking and bicycling to and from school safer for K-12 students through infrastructure improvements, programs, and policies. Passionate about the goal of promoting safety, active transportation, and community engagement while reducing traffic congestion, WAMPO recently hired a consulting firm to assist with SRTS plan development. At this time, more than 50 schools in the WAMPO region have confirmed their participation. As the school year starts this fall, the SRTS team will conduct walk audits, a parent/caregiver survey, and other engagement initiatives as part of the development of school-specific SRTS plans and a Best Practices Guide for the region.

Once SRTS plans are in place, projects and activities identified in those plans (e.g., new crosswalks and sidewalks, safety-education programs) will be better positioned to take advantage of future funding opportunities.

#### **KDOT/WAMPO Behavioral Safety Grants**

The Behavioral Safety Office of the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) and WAMPO are jointly conducting a call for projects for Behavioral Safety Grants in the Wichita metropolitan area. All grants under this program must focus on improving road-user behavior. Grant proposals due September 12, 2025, by 5:00 PM.

## Metropolitan Transportation Plan 2050 (MTP 2050)

The Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) is a federally required, strategic, long-term document guiding future transportation projects in the WAMPO region. In accordance with federal rules, Metropolitan Planning Organizations must involve the public throughout the MTP-development process. Metropolitan Transportation Plan 2050 (MTP 2050) was approved by the Transportation Policy Body (TPB) on May 13, 2025.

#### MTP 2050 Amendment 1

WAMPO has opened the public comment period for Amendment 1 to MTP 2050, July 11, 2025, through July 25, 2025. Public comments received during this period will be reported to and considered by the WAMPO Transportation Policy Body (TPB), which will decide whether to approve MTP 2050 Amendment 1 at their August 12, 2025, meeting.

Proposed MTP 2050 Amendment 1 changes include, among other things:

- The removal of supplemental appendices that are not necessary in the MTP.
- Language adjustments and the removal of some sections to better align with updated federal guidance.
- The removal of references to rescinded Executive Orders.
- Edits to correct grammar, improve word choice, and perform other editorial changes for clarity and accuracy.

No changes are proposed to the project list in MTP 2050.

#### Roadshow for Approved MTP 2050

Following the conclusion of the MTP 2050 Amendment 1 development and approval process, WAMPO staff plan to carry out a roadshow to present the document to the public. A "roadshow" is an outreach activity involving visits to multiple locations and events to promote something. This may include presentations at public meetings, attending community pop-up events, and social media advertisements to encourage ongoing use of the plan. Ongoing discussion of MTP 2050 following adoption will ensure the plan remains relevant. # **Transportation Improvement Program**

All federally funded transportation projects within the WAMPO region, and any additional projects deemed regionally significant by WAMPO in partnership with key stakeholders, are required to appear in the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). These projects are made into a prioritized, four-year list representing funding commitments from local, state, and federal partners that benefit the region. The WAMPO Transportation Policy Body (TPB) approved and amended the FFY2025-FFY2028 TIP on August 13, 2024 (following a public comment period and a recommendation from the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC)). Amendments were approved on October 8, 2024, February 11, 2025, and April 8, 2025.

# Title VI and Limited English Proficiency Plan Updates

WAMPO fully complies with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and related statutes and regulations in all programs and activities, ensuring that no person, on the grounds of race, color, or national origin, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any WAMPO program or activity. This includes ensuring accessibility to programs and services for persons not proficient in the English language. WAMPO's Title VI Program Manual and Limited English Proficiency (LEP) plan will be updated in 2025. #### **Regional Active Transportation Plan**

WAMPO recently released a Request for Proposals (RFP) for a consultant to complete a Regional Active Transportation Plan. The deadline for submission was July 3, and proposals received are under consideration by a selection committee. The purpose of the plan is to assess existing conditions, identify gaps in the nonmotorized-travel network, and recommend strategies and projects for improving regional connectivity for bicycling, walking, and other forms of active transportation.

#### **Household Travel Survey (HTS)**

WAMPO is developing a Request for Proposals (RFP) for a consultant to conduct a Household Travel Survey (HTS) for the region. The purpose of conducting an HTS is to improve the equations underlying the regional Travel Demand Model (TDM), which uses projected future population and employment data to create forecasts of future usage of the transportation network and any resulting traffic congestion, which will be considered during discussions of what changes to the transportation network to invest in and will inform other local planning initiatives to which future traffic levels are relevant. The upcoming WAMPO HTS will capture the travel patterns of various individuals and households in the region.

# **Regional Transportation Updates & Highlights**



## Valley Center Meridian Avenue Reconstruction Project Completion

Meridian Avenue from a quarter mile south of 69<sup>th</sup> Street to the railroad crossing north of 77<sup>th</sup> Street in Valley Center is now open!

Among other changes, there is now a roundabout at the intersection of Meridian Avenue and 69<sup>th</sup> Street and a ten-foot-wide multiuse path along the length of the project.

#### **Wichita Downtown Paid Parking**

On July 1, 2025, the City of Wichita began enforcement of paid parking in the downtown area of the city, 8:00 AM-6:00 PM on Monday-Thursday and 8:00 AM-9:00 PM on Friday-Saturday. More information is available at <a href="https://www.parkwichita.com">www.parkwichita.com</a>.

Starting July 1, 2025, drivers in Kansas are required to move over for all disabled vehicles displaying hazard lights.

#### **Redbud Trail Updates**

Construction bid letting is expected this year on a City of Wichita project to improve a 3.5-mile section of the Redbud Trail between Woodlawn Boulevard and K-96 (near 17th Street). The project will include paving this previously unpaved trail section, making safety improvements to the roadway crossing on the trail section, and, where possible, adding new trail access points and parking areas.
