Safe Routes to School Planning



- On July 14th WAMPO staff were notified via email of an additional funding opportunity from the FHWA.
 - Unused funds were being 'flexed' to State DOTs as part of an annual August Redistribution before the end of the Federal Fiscal Year.
 - MPOs may be eligible to have a portion of this funding suballocated to them and then award these funds to their respective TIP projects and should contact their State DOT for confirmation.
 - Additionally, MPOs were encouraged to reach out quickly, as the email stipulated State DOTs are "responsible for identifying uses for their August redistribution to their FHWA Division Offices by July 28th "



- WAMPO staff promptly contacted KDOT staff regarding eligibility for such funding
 - On July 20th, KDOT staff reported that up to \$5 million in funding could be awarded to WAMPO TIP projects if they could be selected within a tight July timeline
 - For a project to be eligible for this funding, it must be a FFY2023 project that has not yet obligated or be an FTA-transfer project.
 - Furthermore, given the tight time constraint, a typical TAC recommendation and TPB approval cycle could not be completed within the deadline. It was determined all funding changes would need to be completed via administrative adjustment to meet the deadline.
 - The above constraints left precious few projects to absorb the funding.



A short-notice meeting of the PSC was convened July 25th. The PSC recommended increasing funding on the only two eligible non-FTA projects as follows:
